A Word from the Director:

You wouldn't need much time to start a list of all the challenges facing people in our world today. The normal ones are still there: keeping up with family, paying the bills, getting the job done, watching out for the other driver, deciding what to eat and wear each day, remembering that phone call or birthday or anniversary. The list goes on.

Now we have a pandemic called COVID-19, a politically divided nation, and an oil situation that is currently dropping prices but could result in a major spike in the future. How much of all this turmoil is under an individual's control? We have to confess only a small portion. Where or to whom can we go for the wisdom and strength to survive all this? The Bible gives us the answer. We just have to be willing to use it.

In our home is a plaque that reads, "Faith makes things possible, not easy." Jesus promised his disciples in his last conversation with them as recorded in John 14 he would not leave them as orphans. He would send to them the "Paraclete", a counselor, comforter, and teacher that we know as the Holy Spirit.

As we face the difficulties of our world, we are assured by Jesus we do not face these challenges alone. We do not pretend to understand God's timing or his methods of intervening in the human context, but we must believe he cares and he will provide all we need in his own perfect way.

God gave us a brain to use as we pass through this world, the ability to think rationally. Using it properly we call common sense. There is also a higher way of thinking that is more important. One might call that using Kingdom sense. In that situation we depend upon the Holy Spirit to enlighten us, strengthen us, and give us the patience to wait upon the hand of the Lord to move.

In the world's priority system, you must think of self first. Others must get along on their own the best they can. You owe them nothing. Kingdom sense says we live by faith. We love God above all, we love our neighbor as ourselves, and we do to others as we would want them to do to us. That means we allow the Holy Spirit to live in us and work through us so the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) will be able to impact the lives of people around us. This will not get rid of all our problems, but it will make them easier to face.


