A Word from the Director:

What do you think should be the proper attitude when you join with the family of God in worship? In the many decades I have served and been a guest of local churches, I have seen a wide variety of approaches. Which one is best I still am trying to decide.

At least one church I attended had the first part of Psalm 46:10 over its sanctuary entrance, "Be still and know that I am God." There was no mistaking what that church expected from the people who came to their facilities.

The sanctuary represented the Presence of God. You were to open those doors quietly and reverently, go to your seat, and speak in a whisper if at all. You were to follow the prescribed order of service. You were to make a sound when told to do so, and otherwise remain quiet.

Without using a banner to tell everyone they are welcome, some churches make it obvious that worship is a reunion of the family of God. People are expected to meet, greet, and get caught up on the week's events before the instrumentalist starts the prelude. If you expected a time of silence before music marked the beginning of the service, you are at the wrong church.

This congregation hopefully will include you in those informal greetings, although that doesn't always happen. People show they are glad to see each other. They will walk across the room to speak to someone they may not have seen since the previous Sunday. The attitude of all is this is family time.

What climate does your congregation seek to create before a worship service? Are those first moments a time to celebrate being a part of the family of God? Is it a time of silence with a chance to close your mind to all else except the Presence of God?

While trying not to be a judge of what is right and what is wrong, let me direct your thoughts to Ephesians 3:10. "... that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places." (NASB) The Apostle Paul is telling us God may be our primary audience when we worship, but there is an entire spiritual realm watching to see what our true priority will be.

That spiritual realm includes more than we can imagine. God's angels are watching to see how the Creator will be glorified through the lives of his creation. Demonic forces are hoping the creature will fail since the Creator-Son did not. Though God's overall plan will end in victory, those forces look for defeats among the fallen members of mankind.

The next time you enter the sanctuary to join with the people of God in corporate worship, remember

who is watching. It is far more than the people sitting behind you.




